

The village can appear a bit unkempt at times due to scruffy hedging and messy roads and no foot paths to help this but generally apart from the amount of traffic and speed its is fine.

If anything was to go ahead or change within the village, would we be informed first of how much if any change this would make to our community tax as at present Beighton that has nothing compared to other villages has a high community tax which is hard enough to pay now without it increasing?

Qu 35 & Qu 57 answered No only due to work. Thank you for giving us the opportunity to voice our opinions and give feedback regarding life in Beighton. As residents of Southwood Road, just after Donkey Dip we do feel a little bit out of the community. This is made more apparent when the motorists speed out of the restricted speed zone in the main village and then roar past our house. The relative safety at the top of Southwood Road diminishes the further they travel Dow. The road. Interesting the speed restriction extends way past the end of the built up area but not as farvas the last houses in the village, namely ours and our neighbours??!!!?? We love the area but find it astonishing that cars are permitted to go so fast past houses occupied by children and considered part of the village. Our son meets the school bus at Abbey Memorials but because if the traffic speeding problem and lack of footpath there is no way we. Could allow him to make his own way to and from the bus stop. I would love the parish council to explain the thinking behind the positioning of the restricted speed signs and whether they consider the houses and farmhouse at Cucumber Corner as part of the village. I would suggest ALL properties should have the same protection from one of the biggest risks to our safety. Perhaps dialogue could begin to address this obvious oversight. Please allow us to be part of Beighton and the lovely community and location we are so lucky to enjoy, without the fear of having the front of our cars wiped out as we leave or drive or even worse our children and animals hit at 70mph by residents of Freethorpe and Reedham speeding through OUR village. (Address provided, but not input)

We are elderly, but try to support any village activities

I do not feel that Beighton has a community and it's more village people pass through. There is no 'hub' to the village and many. People don't even realise it is here, even though they have lived in neighbouring villages for over 30 years! Freethorpe has a strong community, Beighton is a village I feel quite isolated in even though there are lots of people who live here. I think it has great potential.

Since when has Peacock Corner been known as Reedham Road, it's always been Acle Road since I was born 68 years ago. This could be a problem for "Emergency Services"

There isn't much of a sense of 'community' - a new focus/new village hall and associated activities would invigorate the whole comment.

I have previously given my details to help with a speed watch but nothing has been done about this. Why?

Despite Moulton's close proximity to Acle it can feel quite isolated because it does not have any amenities nor the safety to walk to them. Beighton is also similar and more spread out. They do not feel like villages at all. Freethorpe and Reedham are more acceptable. Would prefer an LPG scheme for fuel

not oil.

Public footpaths need to be better maintained. Shrubby overgrowth needs to be cut back and paths on fields should be reinstalled after ploughing.

I can see the residents of Beighton giving a more positive answer to this questionnaire, however we live in the country because we are country people and Moulton has nowhere for specific facilities. Apart from a post box and a redundant church we are quite isolated. No one in our household is in very good health and we would love peace and quiet which was how the area was in the 1980's when we moved here, but it seems that it will never be so again.

No further developments, pavements or street lighting means retained rural feel and look.
