Crime Updates 1st-30th September 2019

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	1	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary Business and Community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary Residential	2	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	6	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	9	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	2	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	1	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	2	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place.
Theft from a person	1	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

The KICKS programme delivered by the Norwich City Community Sports Foundation Norwich City Football Club is funded by the Premier League, with additional support from CSF, KICKS targets young people who have previously proven difficult to reach and helps guide them towards a range of sporting activities, using football as the main engagement tool.

Various workshops and sessions are delivered educating young people on issues they face on a daily basis, which include; sexual health advice, stop smoking advice and CV writing & career advice

Sessions run five nights a week across 13 centres for 40 weeks of the year, with an average of 60 hours of contact time for every participant.

Over the winter months there is sometimes an increased number of reports of theft of heating oil. If you notice any suspicious activity, such as people in cars or vans looking into gardens and oil tanks, s. Try to take note of type of the type of vehicle and index number if possible, writing descriptions of the people, or taking a photograph. Stay inside your home until you are sure it is safe.

If you have good reason to believe that there is a theft in progress, you should call 999 and await instruction from the police.

There are a few things you can do to protect your oil tank by making it less visible, place fence panels or plant bushes around it to not make them less visible from the road, or have security lighting near to the oil tank. Tank alarms are also available which sound if a sudden drop of oil happens which could indicate a theft or leak.
